## Lansing Police Department September 2019 Activity Report

### 911 Center

- During the month of September, the 911 center handled 8876 calls and 4,199 police incident numbers were created.

### Training

- D.C. Roberts & Sgt. Lazowski attended a seminar regarding the Aurora, IL shooting incident.
- New officers Brenden A'hearn and Jacob Ryan began the ISP basic police training academy.
- Several other officers attended training courses on vehicle stops, death investigation seminar, evidence based interviews, tactical patrol rifle, & ground fighting techniques for female officers.

### Activity

- 255 municipal citations were issued. (49 for Failure to Display Village Stickers).
- 334 State traffic offenses were issued. (Speeding, disobeyed stop signs, etc.)
- 87 Arrests were made during the month.
- 658 Traffic Stops / 350 Community Policing contacts/ 935 Premise Checks were conducted.
- 21 Abandoned vehicles were located and notice served to the owners.
- \$325.00 in Oxcart permits collected (7 Permits) & \$24,00 in administrative fees were collected.

Concentrated attention was provided by the patrol division on speeding vehicles on 182 St., and Ridge Rd., vehicles turning left onto Torrence Ave., business checks throughout town to explain the LPD Business Watch program & Railway safety week with tips & pamphlets provided to motorists.

### Miscellaneous

- The Lansing Police Department will again host DEA National Take back day on October 26<sup>th</sup> from 10am-2pm. Unwanted or unused prescriptions can be brought to the police department for disposal.
- New solar powered radar signs were installed in the 18000 Blk. of Burnham & 2700 Blk. Of Ridge Rd. compliments of the ComEd Powering Safe Community Grant. **Special thanks to LPW for their assistance in the installation.**
- LPD welcomed new Community Service officers; Ashley Luna & Jose Garcia, also new 911 dispatcher Christopher Norris. Officers Victor Aviles and James Burke graduated from the basic police training course held at the College of DuPage.
- LPD received two federal grants. One grant for \$3,450 towards the purchase of bullet proof vests. The second grant was for \$40,000 to be used towards the purchase of body cameras.
