Lansing Police Department December 2019 Activity Report

911 Center

During the month of December, the Lansing 911 center handled 8,356 general calls which
resulted in 3461 police incident numbers being created. We ended 2019 having 47,978
police incident numbers created. The 911 center handled over 100,700 calls during 2019.

Training

- Lt. Schoon attended a Firearms Instructor course.
- Det.'s Dosen and Lindemulder attended a Lead Homicide training course.
- Sergeant Lazowski attended a Managing a Criminal Investigative Unit course.
- Officers Meyer and Fitzgerald attended a De-Escalation Techniques course.
- Sgt. Hynek attended the Enforcing Cannabis Law course.
- Lt. Bailey provided Crime Free Housing education to rental property owners.

Activity

- 301 municipal citations were issued. (76 for Failure to Display Village Stickers).
- 258 State traffic offenses were issued. (Speeding, disobeyed stop signs, etc.)
- 82 Arrests were made during the month.
- 364 Traffic Stops / 86 Community Policing contacts/ 832 Premise Checks were conducted.
- \$1,155 in Oxcart permits collected (13 Permits) & \$14,500 in administrative fees were collected. The year-end total for administrative fees totaled \$219,500 which represents an increase of \$20,500 dollars from 2018.
- 19 abandoned vehicles were located and notices served.
- Sgt. Butler conducted Tobacco compliance checks in local businesses- one citation was issued (GOLO).
- The LPD Investigative unit in cooperation with Cook Co. S.D. conducted a prostitution sting at area hotels. 10 citations were issued for prostitution related offenses.
