Lansing Police Department January 2021 Activity Report

911 Center

- The Lansing 911 center handled 6805 calls, of these there were 3746 police calls for service generated.

Training

- LPD Emergency Response Team (ERT) conducted training at MAAC Foundations – Emergency Services Training Facility in Valparaiso, IN.
- Det. Murrin III and Ofc. Olin attended the Reid School of Interviews and Interrogations.
- Det. Murrin III and Det. Miklusak attended the Reid School of Advanced Interviews and Interrogations.
- Officers Donnewald, Ryan, and Catron completed Juvenile Officer School and are now certified Juvenile Officers.
- Officer Slocum returned to the College of Dupage Basic Academy after it was closed due to COVID concerns, and is now expected to graduate February 26th, 2021.

Activity

- 593 Traffic Stops / 112 Community Policing contacts / 1294 premise checks were conducted.
- 73 Arrests were made.
- 453 Municipal citations (M's) were issued in the month (125 for having no Village Stickers).
- 16 Municipal Ordinance citations (MO's) were issued.
- 268 State traffic offenses were issued (Speeding, Disobeyed stop signs, etc.).
- \$18,500 in administrative fees were collected.
- 4 Overweight permits were issued through OxCart Permits, resulting in \$500 in permit fees received.

Miscellaneous

- On 01/13/21, Chief Dennis Murrin Jr. retired from the Police department after 30 years of full-time service. Deputy Chief Rick Slough was named the interim Chief of Police pending the appointment of the next Chief of Police.
- Three (3) 2021 Ford Hybrid Police Interceptor SUV's were received through the Enterprise Leasing Program. They were delivered to Federal Signal, where they will have all of the emergency equipment installed, including the graphics, radios, new tablet computers, and video cameras. The squads are expected to be in service in February.
- Sgt. Butler completed a tobacco compliance check, funded through a grant from the Illinois Department of Human Services. The Village of Lansing has 10 retailers that sell tobacco products. Of those ten (10), seven (7) were found in compliance, and three (3) were issued citations for selling tobacco products to a minor.
