**AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF LANSING, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS,
AMENDING ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 38 OF ITS CODE OF ORDINANCES
REGARDING OVERWEIGHT AND OVER-DIMENSION VEHICLE PERMIT
APPLICATIONS**

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WHEREAS, the Village of Lansing, Cook County, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the “*Home Rule Powers*”); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) may from time to time amend the text of the Lansing Code when it is determined to be in the best interests of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the Village must update the permitting process that allows for overweight and over-dimension vehicles to drive within the Village limits for a fee; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) have determined that the following changes to its applicable ordinance regarding the issuance of permits for overweight and over-dimension vehicles driving within Village limits is in the best interest of the Village in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lansing, Cook County, Illinois, by and through their Home Rule authority, as follows:

Section 1: That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and

correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2: Section 38-26 of Article II of Chapter 38 of the Lansing Code is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the underlined language as follows:

Sec. 38-26. - Permits for overweight and over-dimension vehicles; application; fees; issuance; display; escorts; violations.

a) The Village with respect to any street or highway under its jurisdiction may upon application to the Police Chief, or his designee, in form prescribed by the police Chief, issue a special permit authorizing the applicant to operate or move a vehicle or combination of vehicles of a size or weight of vehicle or load exceeding the maximum specified in section 38-25. The applicant shall furnish the following information, in addition to such other reasonable information the Police Chief may require, in the special permit application:

- 1) The name and address of the owner or lessee of the vehicle;
- 2) Applicant's name;
- 3) Type of permit request whether it be for a single trip, round trip or multiple routing;
- 4) The description and registration of the power unit;
- 5) Description of the object or vehicle to be moved;
- 6) The number of axles of the vehicle or combination of vehicles;
- 7) The axle weights of all single, tandem or series axles;
- 8) Gross weight of the vehicle;
- 9) The width, length and height of the vehicle and load;
- 10) The origin of the load within the state or state line if the origin is outside the village jurisdiction;
- 11) Requested routing over village streets and to specific location.

b) Permits for single and round trip movements shall be issued as follows:

- 1) Permits for a single trip routing (one way movement) will be valid for seven calendar days from date of issuance.
 - 2) Permits for a round trip routing (two way movement) will be valid for 14 calendar days from date of issuance.
- c) Permits for multiple round-trip routing or limited continuous operation (“LCO Permit”), shall be issued as follows:
- 1) LCO Permits may be issued to a single power unit as quarterly (ninety (90) days) or annually (three hundred sixty-five (365) days) from the date of issuance.
 - 2) Vehicles issued LCO Permits are non-transferrable between vehicles and may make unlimited over-weight and over-dimension moves on village streets within the limitations of the LCO Permit.
- d) The Police Chief or his designee is authorized to approve the application for approved routes. Upon approval and payment of all required fees the Police Chief shall issue a permit allowing passage of the oversize and/or overweight vehicles over village streets.
- e) Fees for permits shall be assessed as follows:

- 1) If vehicles are both over-weight and over-dimension, the applicable single trip or round-trip fees for both weight and dimension must be paid to obtain a permit. The round-trip fees for dimensions shall be added to any LCO Permit.

- 2) Permit applicants, based within the Village, requesting an annual LCO Permit, shall be subject to the following fee structure and restrictions:
 - a. Annual fee - \$100.00 total, which is transferrable amongst all vehicles owned and operated by applicant.

 - b. Road restrictions - This restricted LCO Permit is valid for the following roads only:
 - i. Chappel Avenue
 - ii. Volbrecht Road
 - iii. 175th Street (frontage road)

- 3) Permit applicants, based within an adjacent municipality to the Village, requesting an annual restricted LCO Permit, shall be subject to the following fee structure and restrictions:
 - a. Annual fee - \$200 .00 total, which is transferrable amongst all vehicles owned and operated by applicant.

 - b. Road restrictions - This restricted LCO Permit is valid for the following roads only:
 - i. Chappel Avenue
 - ii. Volbrecht Road

iii. 175th Street (frontage road)

- f) It is the permittee's duty to read and familiarize himself with the permit provisions upon receipt. The undertaking of the permit move is deemed prima facie evidence of acceptance of the permit and that:
- 1) The permittee is in compliance with all operation requirements;
 - 2) All dimension and weight limitations specified in the permit will not be exceeded;
 - 3) All operation, registration and license requirements have been complied with;
 - 4) All financial responsibilities, obligations and other legal requirements have been met; and
 - 5) The permittee assumes all responsibility for injury or damage to persons or to public or private property, including his own, or to the object being transported, caused directly or indirectly by the transportation or movement of vehicles and objects authorized under the permit. He agrees to hold the village harmless from all suits, claims, damages, or proceedings of any kind and to indemnify the village for any claim it may be required to pay arising from the movement.
- g) The permit shall be accessible in the vehicle to which the permit applies at all times while operating on streets within the village and shall be exhibited upon demand to any enforcement officer, police officer or other authorized village official.
- h) Civilian and/or police escort of over-weight and/or over-dimension vehicles shall be required as follows:
- 1) Class 3B vehicles may require a civilian escort vehicle. The driver of a civilian escort vehicle must be in radio contact with the driver of a permit vehicle.
 - 2) Class 4B vehicles may require a civilian escort vehicle along with a Lansing Police Department vehicle escort. The driver of a civilian escort vehicle must be in radio contact with the driver of a permit vehicle.
 - 3) Class 2C vehicles require at least one (1) civilian escort vehicle. The driver of a civilian escort vehicle must be in radio contact with the driver of a permit vehicle.
 - 4) Class 3C vehicles require at least one (1) civilian escort vehicle and may also

require a Lansing Police Department vehicle escort. The driver of a civilian escort vehicle must be in radio contact with the driver of a permit vehicle.

- i) Whenever any vehicle is operated in violation of village permit provisions, whether it be by size, weight or general provisions, and either or both the owner or operator of such vehicle shall be deemed guilty and either or both the owner or the operator of such vehicle may be prosecuted for such violation.

Section 3: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

Section 4: All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5: The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its adoption, approval and publication to ensure the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village.
