911 Center

• During the month of September, the Lansing 911 center handled 8187 calls. Of these, there were 3504 police calls.

Training

<u>Activity</u>

- 500 Traffic Stops / 117 Community Policing contacts/ 1013 premise checks were conducted.
- 77 Arrests were made.
- 701 Municipal citations were issued in the month. (639 for having no Village Stickers)
- 288 State traffic offenses were issued. (Speeding, disobeyed stop signs, etc.)
- \$21,500 in administrative fees were collected. Two Oxcart fees were collected (\$250.00).
- 11 abandoned vehicles were located and notices served.
- The patrol division concentrated enforcement efforts on village sticker offenses, and community policing efforts on the bike path, local parks, and baseball fields utilizing the LPD UTV vehicle.
